8 SUTHERLAND, RULE, WILLIAMSON.

The boat was located on the shoreline with one body close by. Search continued till dark for the other but nothing found. (Never one around when you want one)

17 At 23.30 R28 lifted to assist the 70 yr old sailing trawler "WILLY McCANN" which had run aground at Donna Nook with 19 on board. on arrival she was seen to be nose into shore in breaking surf, rolling and pitching. The skipper said that due to an oversight he had no 1SJ's on board. R28 using a Hi Line got a tow line across from the Humber Life boat but that snapped. R28 then put a line from the boat to the shore party for a breaches bouy. R28 RTB get the other A/C as the first was u/s. Returned at 02.55 Colt had joined in by this time and had managed to winch some off, R28 wiced remainder off leaving skeleton crew on. She boat was now firmly aground on the ebb tide. R28 went home landing at 03.45. The "willy mccann" was dragged off 2 days later.

20 SUTHERLAND, HEWITT, WILLIAMSON.

Night search for the crew of a Bell 212 which had crashed into the sea close to a drilling rig off the Humber. Crash was unsurvivable only wreckage found.

R28 sent to site of crashed glider at Sutton Bank , crash pilot stretcher lifted and taken to Northallerton Hosp. with head injuries. He turned out to be a nieghbour of our pilot (small world)

# Copter hunt for missing boy

ANXIOUS police today called up a helicopter from RAF Leconfield in their search for a 12-year-old Hornsea boy missing from home.

Henry Wormald, of Elvaston Avenue, ran away at about 3.30 pm yesterday afternoon after an argument with his foster mother.

Police were alerted and more than 20 officers and coastguards carried out an all-night search for the youngster who attends the Bridge View School at Hessele.

Police from Bridlington, Hornsea and Beverley anxiously combed the area but the search was hampered by darkness.

Sgt. Bill Sparnon, who is leading the hunt, said he was now extremely concerned about the boy's safety.

"It is believed the boy will attempt to avoid being found. We fear for his safety in view of the low temperature during the night, and request motorists and householders to keep a look out for him," he said.

He added that the boy was thought to be in open countryside between Hornsea and Ganstead and asked farmers especially to look out for him.

Henry is described as about 5ft. tall, of stocky build, and with short brown hair that sticks up. He was wearing a light blue anorak, blue jeans, and black training shoes when he went missing.
