Stung diver is home

THE diver airlifted to hospital by helicopter on Monday, after being stung by a jelly fish, was named as Reynold Barker, 21, from Bath.

Mr Barker was stung in the mouth and was lifted from a boat near Whitby to Scarborough Hospital.

But he developed "the bends" and was again carried by a helicopter from RAF Leconfield to Great Yarmouth's James Paget Hospital which has a decompression unit.

After treatment he was allowed home yesterday.

It was not known who Mr Barker was working for although it was suggested his boat was a fishing research vessel.

He was diving about five miles offshore from Staithes. Yesterday a spokesman at the Natural History Museum at Scarborough said there were a lot of large jelly-fish about, attracted by cooler waters at this time of year.
